Ms. Christina Monaco joined the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) in April 2013 and is currently the Acting Director of the Xperience Directorate (X). In this role, she is leading the transformation of NGA into a customer-centric and consequence-focused organization under the Customer Service Portfolio.

Ms. Monaco has served in a number of positions within the intelligence community. Her federal career began in 1990 with the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI) as a HUMINT collector in Task Force 168, and she worked in human intelligence (HUMINT) collection and foreign materiel acquisition programs for several years. In 1996, she served as the Foreign Intelligence Liaison Officer for the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Naval Forces Europe intelligence staff, based in Naples, Italy. In 2003, she began working in DIA's Chief Financial Executive element as the Chief of the HUMINT Programs and Functional Management Division and subsequently in the Defense Intelligence Resource Management Office as the deputy of the Program Evaluation Division and the chair of the Measurement and Signatures Intelligence Program Review Panel. She was appointed as a Defense Intelligence Senior Level executive in 2007 as the Senior Financial Expert for HUMINT Management, in an advisory role to the Chief of the Defense HUMINT Management Office to the DIA Chief Financial Executives. In 2008 she was appointed as the Deputy Chief Financial Executive for HUMINT and CI, and in this role participated in the stand-up of the DIA Defense CI and HUMINT Center and related transfer of the DoD Counterintelligence Field Activity into DIA. She transitioned to DIA's Office of Congressional and Public Affairs in 2009 as the Chief of Congressional Relations.

Ms. Monaco joined NGA on a Joint Duty Assignment in 2013 as the Chief of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs, responsible for developing and executing a congressional engagement strategy that conveyed NGA priorities to Members of Congress and their oversight committee staff.
