

Alex Measure is a senior economist at the Bureau of Labor Statistics specializing in the application of machine learning and natural language processing techniques to the production of government statistics. He created and maintains the machine learning system now responsible for classifying hundreds of thousands of written descriptions of work related injury and illness each year at better than human accuracy. He has also advised and helped a wide variety of state, national, and international agencies build similar systems. His current research focuses on the use of deep neural networks for language processing and on techniques for building machine learning systems when training data is scarce.
