Ms. Flynn is a 30-year veteran of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) where she held senior executive positions including Director of the CIA's Leadership Academy, Associate Deputy Director of the National Counterterrorism Center, Executive Director of the CIA Counterterrorism Center, Director of the Office of Foreign Intelligence Relationships, Chief of Station in major posts in Southeast Asia and Latin America, and Clandestine Operations Officer in Africa and Southeast Asia.

Ms. Flynn is also an adjunct Professor at Georgetown University's Walsh School of Foreign Service/Security Studies Program where she teaches graduate seminars on intelligence, counter-terrorism, cyber security, and national security. She serves as Adjunct Staff at Rand Corporation, is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, and a senior fellow at the Foreign Policy Research Institute.
