

Jamie Brown, Director of Global Government Relations

Jamie Brown is Director of Global Government Relations for CA Technologies, managing global cybersecurity, cloud computing, and Internet of Things policy issues. In his role at CA, Brown engages directly with policy makers in both the US and globally on policy development and industry best practices. Brown also serves on the Executive Committee for the Information Technology Sector Coordinating Council, which is the principal IT industry entity for coordinating with the government on a wide range of critical infrastructure protection and cybersecurity activities and issues. He also leads the Government Relations Working Group for the Software Assurance Forum on Excellence in Code (SAFECode), a nonprofit organization made up of leading global information technology companies, dedicated to increasing trust in information and communications technology products and services through the advancement of effective software assurance methods. Brown has been featured on Government Matters, a multi-platform news program dedicated to providing information and analysis to federal managers and contractors, and has written articles for Washington Technology and NextGov.

Brown joined CA after serving as a Professional Staff Member on the House Science Subcommittee on Research and Technology, where he managed Committee legislation and oversight activities for cybersecurity, innovation, and manufacturing issues. Brown managed Committee work on the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), on the Department of Transportation Research and Technology programs, and on Health Information Technology programs. Brown helped draft cloud computing provisions in cybersecurity research and development legislation that was signed into law in 2014. He was also the lead Committee staff negotiator for the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program reauthorization, and the reauthorization of surface transportation research and development programs.

Brown previously held business development positions in both government relations and in financial data sales.

Brown earned a Master of Science degree in Social Policy from the London School of Economics and Political Science in 2002, and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Cornell University in 1998.
