



Jose Pitti is the Branch Chief for the United States Asylum Program's Innovation and Design Branch. Jose first joined the USCIS Asylum Division in 2012 as a Presidential Management Fellow and returned to the Asylum Division in February 2020 after serving as a Policy Advisor in the DHS Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties, where he conducted civil rights compliance investigations and provided related policy recommendations to DHS components. Jose has adjudicated asylum, humanitarian protection, and refugee applications at the Chicago Asylum Office, Houston Asylum Office, and United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees' Caribbean Protection Unit. At Asylum Division headquarters, he has previously served as a program manager for credible fear quality assurance review, asylum case-management software systems, asylum-related employment authorization issues, and the reporting of asylum case data.
