

Nancy R. Kruger Deputy Director National Association of Clean Air Agencies

Nancy Kruger joined the National Association of Clean Air Agencies (NACAA) in 1986. Since the 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act she has been actively involved in the implementation of statutory and regulatory requirements affecting state and local air agencies. In addition to working very closely with NACAA's members on a daily basis, Nancy works with a variety of groups including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and other federal agencies, the U.S. Congress, public and private interest groups, other associations of state and local agencies and representatives of elected officials to communicate the perspectives of NACAA's members with respect to the effective control of air quality and protection of public health, advance the association's positions and find ways to bridge differences and collaborate on issues of common concern.

As Deputy Director of NACAA, Nancy assists the Executive Director in managing the NACAA headquarters office and overseeing the association's programs and activities, which allows her to be involved in the full range of clean air issues. In addition, Nancy leads all of NACAA's initiatives on mobile sources, fuels, transportation and criteria pollutants, including implementation of National Ambient Air Quality Standards. Nancy is a member of EPA's Clean Air Act Advisory Committee (CAAAC) and CAAAC Mobile Sources Technical Review Subcommittee. She holds a B.A. in German and an M.B.A., both from The George Washington University.
