

With more than 20 years of emergency management experience, Greg Brunelle has served in senior executive positions in government and the private sector. In 2016, Mr. Brunelle joined One Concern, Inc., an innovative start-up that uses artificial intelligence and machine learning to achieve comprehensive community resilience, as a Senior Emergency Management Advisor before joining full time in 2017, as the Director of Engagement for North America.

After beginning his career as a firefighter and medic, Greg served as the Deputy Director (2001-2005) and Director (2005-2007) of the Office of Fire and Emergency Management in Jefferson County, NY. From 2007 to 2013, Mr. Brunelle served in the State of New York's Office of Emergency Management, predominately as the Executive Deputy Director and Deputy Director of Operations. In these positions, he led the State's Emergency Operations Center, and coordinated response operations to major planned events and regional emergencies as well as 13 Presidentially-declared Major Disasters. During the initial response to Hurricane Sandy in 2012, Governor Cuomo appointed Mr. Brunelle as Acting Director of Emergency Management, a position he held throughout the remainder of the response to Sandy, including the short-term recovery efforts for that historic storm.

In 2013, Greg joined Tetra Tech, Inc. as Vice President of Emergency Management and Community Resilience, leading their emergency management projects nationwide. He continued to support response operations, serving as Deputy State Coordinating Officer for the State of Hawaii during Hurricane Iselle response operations in 2014, the strongest tropical cyclone to strike the Big Island in recorded history.

Greg received a Bachelor's in History and Sociology, a Certificate of Study in Health Systems Administration from the Rochester Institute of Technology, and a Master's Degree in Organizational Psychology from Capella University. He is also a graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School's Center for Homeland Defense and Security, earning a Master's in Security Studies. He serves as the Chair of the Advisory Board for SUNY New Paltz's Institute of Disaster Mental Health and teaches as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Albany.
