

Scott Scheurich has been involved in the National Capital Region (NCR) Interoperable Communications Infrastructure (ICI) since January 2006. In that time, he has served multiple technical and management roles in the execution of regional, information technology funded by federal homeland security grants. Since 2011, he has been the Project Manager for the Identity and Access Management Service (IAMS) which has been successful in authenticating and authorizing government end users to regional, first responder applications by using existing security credentials. Beginning in 2008, Mr. Scheurich has been the Technical Project Manager for the NCR Fire and Rescue CAD2CAD Service which has significantly reduced the time to request and dispatch fire resources to mutual aid events occurring in and around the NCR. Each project is a current or past recipient of the Commonwealth of Virginia Governor's Technology Awards.

He has also been responsible for developing security policy and practices implemented within the ICI and manages the regional team responsible for operating the ICI which includes the NCRnet - a 24x7 supported, private, first responder, high speed data network interconnecting various, local government enterprise networks in the NCR.

Mr. Scheurich is a Program Manager with Ashburn Consulting LLC, a small business in Northern Virginia aimed at providing information security services and technology to federal, State, and local governments and educational entities. In his 17 plus years of work experience in the information technology field, Mr. Scheurich has supported numerous federal agencies including the Internal Revenue Service, Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and Department of Energy in developing security strategy, risk assessment frameworks, security technology evaluation and selection, security testing and evaluation, and identity management. Mr. Scheurich was a member of the development team for the prototype Federal Bridge Certification Authority while working at MitreTek Systems (now Noblis).
