

Samuel Sanders Visner (Sam) is a national recognized cyber- and national security expert, currently serving as Director of the National Cybersecurity Federally Funded Research and Development Center (NCF) at MITRE, which develops architectures and solutions to strengthen the cybersecurity of the nation's business and critical infrastructure.
