Dr. Scott Winiecki received his MD degree from the University of Maryland and completed his pediatric training at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. After 12 years in private pediatric practice, he joined the U.S. Food and Drug Administration in 2011. In 2012, he received the FDA's "Outstanding New Reviewer" Award for his work on thromboembolism after administration of immune globulin products. In 2014, he received a Public Health Achievement Award for leading the first project at FDA to use Sentinel electronic data combined with medical record review to rapidly refine a safety concern. After 5 ½ years working on biologics, he joined the Center for Drugs in September, 2016. He is currently Director of the Safe Use Initiative, a group whose goal is to reduce preventable harm from medications by collaborating with both public and private groups within the healthcare community.
